Sea lamprey (Petromizon marinus)

Sea lamprey is also an anadromous species that has experienced serious declines during the last century, rendering their inclusion in Annex II of the EU Habitats Directive. Threatened by the fragmentation of rivers, dredging and sediment pollution, especially in the Mediterranean basin is considered rare and vulnerable Sea lamprey spawns in the lower reaches of the Ebre River, but adults and also larvae have been greatly diminished. Only several individuals have been catched during last years. Unfortunately, there is not so much available information on this fish species. Currently sea lamprey has a low population in Catalonia, only at the lower Ebre and Delta, and probably at its limit of survival.
